Change the World

Dear Anubhutians.

Recently I came across the speech of a Commander-in-chief. "If we wanna change the world, start off by making your bed. If you make your bed every morning, you will have accomplished the first tasks of the day. It gives you a small sense of pride and it will encourage you to do another task and another and another. By the end of the day, that one task completed will have turned into many tasks completed. Making your bed will also reinforce the fact that little things in life matters. If you can't do the little things right, you will never be able to do the big things right. If, by chance, you have a miserable day, you will come home to a bed that you 'made'; and a made-bed gives you encouragement_that tomorrow will be better."

He narrated how he has been trained for different tasks. 'To pass 'SEAL' training, there are a series of long swims that must be completed. One is the night swim. Before the swim, the instructor briefs, "Though no student has ever been eaten by a shark, if a shark begins to circle your position, stay in your ground; do not swim away; do not act afraid. If the shark is hungry for a midnight snack and darts towards you, then summon up all your strength and punch him in the snout. Then he will turn and swim away. There are a lot of sharks in the world. If you hope to complete the swim, you will have to deal with them. If you want to change the world, don't back down from the sharks..."

From the series of examples of training, there is one more worth telling.

"The last week of training is referred to as Hell week. It is 6 days and no sleep. Constant mental and physical harassment; and one special day at the mud flats, where mud will engulf you, one has to spend 15 hours trying to survive the freezing cold and howling wind and the incessant pressure to 'quit' from the instructors. As the sun began to set in the evening, the mud consumed each man until there was nothing visible but heads. The instructor

told them, they could leave the mud, only five men would quit, only five could get out of the oppressive cold. Looking around mud flats, it was apparent that some students were about to give up; it was still over eight hours until the Sun came up. Eight more hours of bone-chilling cold. The chattering teeth and shivering moans of the trainees were so loud, it was hard to hear anything...

"Then one voice began to echo through the night... one voice raised in song... the song was terribly out of tune but sung with great enthusiasm, one voice became two and two became three and before long, everyone in the class was singing. The instructors threatened them but they kept up the singing. The singing persisted and somehow mud seemed a little warmer and the wind a little tamer and the dawn not so far away. Is it the power of hope, power of one person.. A Washington.. A Lincoln... Mandela – Malala –one person can change the world by giving people hope. So if we want to give hope, start each day with a task completed; find someone to help you through life; respect everyone; know that life is not fair and that you will fail often, but if you take some risks, step up when the times are toughest, face down the bullies, lift up the downtrodden and never, never give up. "If you do these things, the next generation and the next generation and the generations that follow will line in a world far better than one we have today; and what started here, will indeed, have changed the world for the better.
