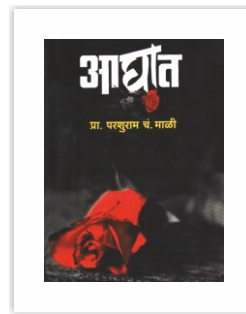
Looking Back
