A special assembly was conducted by Parvathi akka in which the class 7 students presented skits and songs which inspired the audience.



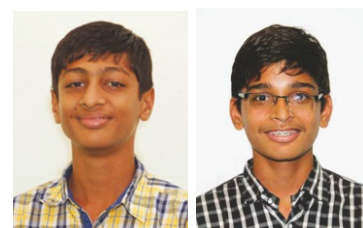
