Tissue Culture - A Learning Experience

On 4th and 5th of August 2016 grade 8 students were in the conference room of world's No.1 Jain Tissue Culture lab with their biology teacher Jayshree Akka; imbibing knowledge and looking forward to try their hands on the techniques of plant tissue culture through callus culture. They got a close look of the different ex-plants like seeds, leaves, apical and axillary buds used for vegetative propagation of plant by this method. They learned about a marine algae called agar which is the most important ingredient in the used nutrient media on which the ex-plant is grown. They were surprised to know that coal is used as one of the ingredients in the growing media. They learned every detail from the lab to farm journey of a sapling from Dr. Jeetendra Patil. They got to see the functioning of the rare equipment and apparatuses like micropipette, forceps, stirrer, autoclave, pH meter, media mixer etc. used in the process. Vegetative propagation of

plants in Jain Tissue culture lab is done successfully for banana, pomegranate, strawberry, guava etc. Students were enthralled by the scientific idea that has changed the life of millions of farmers around the world. Thanks to the organizers.
