


A WEDDING RECEPTION WITH A DIFFERENCE

Mr. Sanjay Gulabchand Jain talked to students at a special



To date, Mr. Jain has contributed to the successful launch of 44 vehicles of ISRO, which includes Chandrayan-1, Mangalyan and the record-breaking PSLV mission with 104 satellites and many more. Mr. Jain

interacted with the students and told us about the rocket

launchers and the manufacturing, launching and all the

Starting from the size of the satellite, he explained the whole mechanism in detail. TÊTE-À-TÊTE WITH MR. PRADEEP GUJARATI

Q1. How did you get associated with Anubhuti and Dadaji?

I joined the Jain Group in November, 1992 at the Plastic Park in the customer accounts department. - 1) Confidence: When you are about to start answering the questions, this tool will be of utmost importance. You must have faith in what you have studied. Remember that the less confident you are, the more are the chances of making a mistake
- 2) Peace of Mind: The next important thing would be to make your rushing mind calm down. Meditate for a while before you start the paper and convince yourself that you know what you have studied and assure yourself that you will be able to answer all the questions.
- 3) Self-Talk: It is amazing how much talking to yourself can help you while writing your paper. A simple change in your thoughts can change the way you perceive an examination. If you visualize yourself doing well in the examination, the chances are that you actually will. Make sure that your feelings don't go to the negative side because that will just make things worse.

4) Budget your time: Realizing that time is almost up and many questions are still left will not help you at all to stay focused on the question in hand. Make sure that you divide your time beforehand and leave some for rechecking your answers. In fact, you should keep more time for this especially in mathematics exam. In case you are still short of time, don't panic. Solve the question in hand first and do it calmly. Otherwise, in that moment of fear, you will mess up the remaining questions too.

Armed with these tools, you are now fully prepped to face all your examinations. One thing you must be clear about is that it is only one of the many exams you are going to take in your life. It is not important to get full marks, but it is important to get marks that you have the potential and preparation for.
